Federal Tax Credits

State Tax Deductions

The State of Missouri passed a law including a tax deduction for qualified home energy audits and the recommendations of those audits beginning with the 2009 tax year and extending through 2013.

- Up to \$1000 per year
- Up to \$2000 cumulatively for multiple years
- Requires a home energy audit performed by an energy auditor certified by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources

Utility Rebates

Great news has just been released that Kansas City Power & Light and Missouri Gas Energy have joined forces to help the homeowner improve their energy efficiency.

- Customers with either KCP&L or MGE are eligible for up to \$600
- Customers with both KCP&L and MGE are eligible for up to \$1200
- Requires a home energy audit performed by a certified Home Performance with ENERGY STAR contractor or consultant
